The Venue: Trinity College, Dublin

Its contemporary conference spaces, and seamless accessibility create a professional yet dynamic environment. Surrounded by the university's iconic architecture and vibrant campus atmosphere, it provides an ideal setting for engaging sessions, networking, and memorable delegate experiences.

Who is attending?

The conference is expected to attract over 600 delegates from across the UK and Ireland's experimental medicine infrastructure, including: CRF directors, clinicians, researchers, research nurses and midwives, allied health professionals (AHPs), administrative support staff, laboratory staff, research pharmacists, research managers, quality and regulatory affairs specialists, as well as key research infrastructure funders, research charities and clinical research regulatory bodies.

These delegates include key decision-makers, innovators, and practitioners involved in the leadership, design, support, and delivery of thousands of early phase clinical trials and high intensity studies.



Conference Theme:

The theme of this year's conference is:

'Two Islands, Many Voices – Futurescaping Trans-National Clinical Research'

The conference will be delivered as a partnership between all the CRF/Cs on the Island of Ireland including TCD, UCD, RSCI, UL, CHI, UoG, UCC and Northern Ireland.

It will highlight the diversity of clinical research taking place across the island of Ireland, as well as in England, Scotland and Wales. It will emphasize all-island collaboration between CRCs/CRFs and their translational partnerships. The conference coincides with Ireland's Presidency of the EU and will illustrate the island as a unique connector - to the UK as a close friend, to the EU, through membership and through strong transatlantic links to the rest of the world.

We will showcase the diverse and cohesive research landscape north and south of the border, linking the work through patient and public involvement, community-engaged and primary care research and inclusivity.

The 1926 census has been digitised and will be released for use in 2026. We will leverage this important resource and event to place a focus on digital platforms, data-sharing, and integrated research systems including the wide network of innovation hubs available to clinicians. Although Ireland is behind other countries on this, with forward thinking EHR plans we have an opportunity to build from new, learning from others who have older, less connected, less research friendly systems.

The world has changed since the last conference held in Dublin in 2012. The scientific basis of medicine although evolving rapidly is under threat, as is access to innovative medicines by the most marginalised peoples. It has never been more important for practitioners and the clinical research community to re-focus externally and re-affirm our commitment to national and international collaboration as the engine that drives access to high quality "research-as-care", evidence generation as part of decision making and as a powerful tool for medical diplomacy.

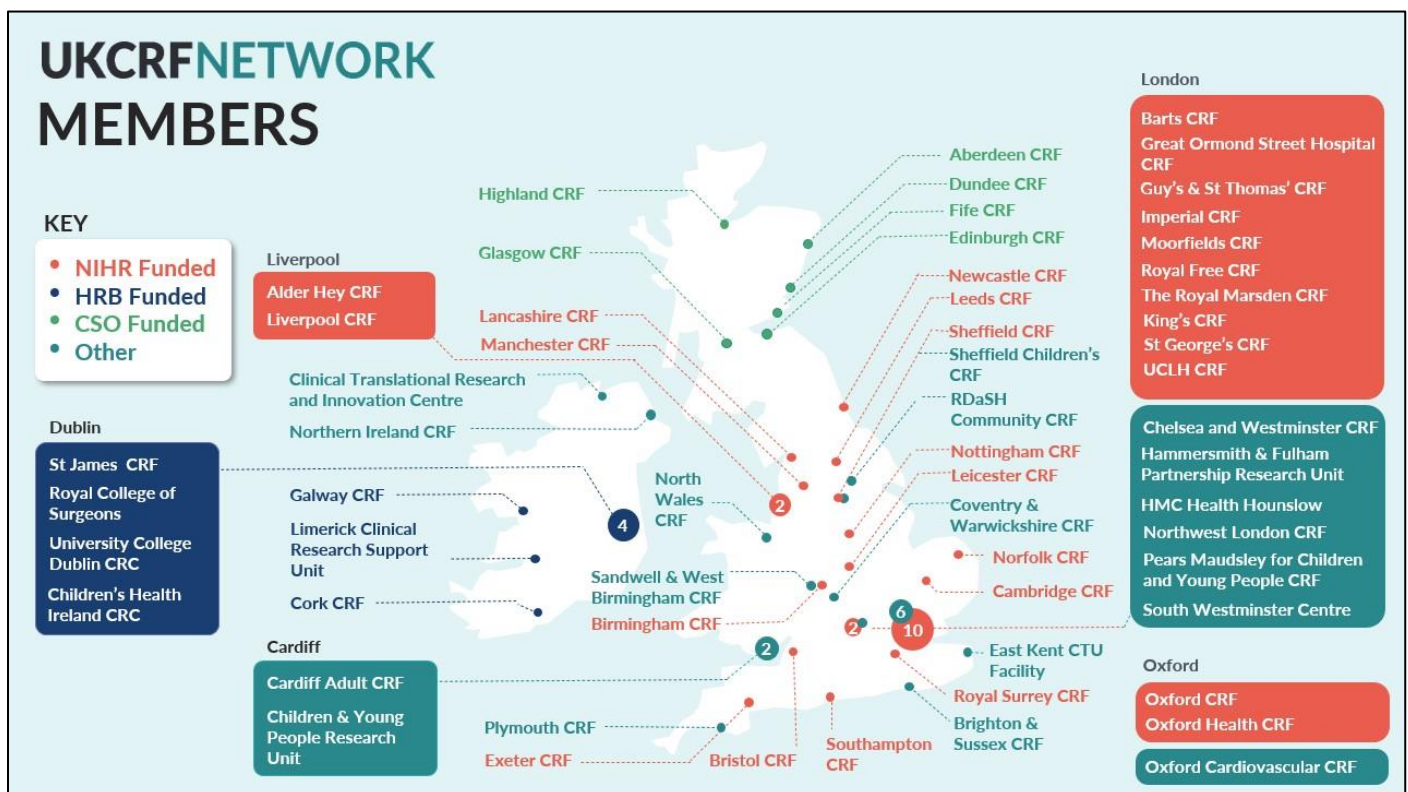

- **Early Translational Research:** Turning scientific discoveries into practical solutions that benefit people's health and well-being.
- **Clinical Trials to Rigorous Safety Standards:** The Network is the gateway to delivering cutting edge experimental medicine clinical research across the UK and Ireland.
